Graduation Requirements For The Class of 2024 Continued:

- Mathematics must include one credit of Algebra 2
- Science must include one credit of a physical science course, one credit of a life science course and one advanced study science credit
- Social Studies must include .5 credit of American History, .5 credit of World History, and .5 credit of US Government
- All students must receive instruction in economics and financial literacy. This is covered in the required Economics course



Graduation Requirements For The Class of 2024 Continued:

- Physical Education and Health Options
 - Traditional PE Courses: Team Activities and Fitness, Dual Activities and Fitness, and Activities and Fitness
 - Summer Online PE
 - Lifetime Fitness PE
 - Online PE
 - PE Waiver
 - By qualifying for a PE waiver, a student does not earn credit and therefore will still need a total of 22 credits to graduate
- Health
 - Health classes taught either in class or online during the school-year and/or summer for one semester



Graduation Requirements For The Class of 2024 Continued:

- Earn a passing score on Ohio's Algebra I and English II tests. Students must re-take each test at least once if they did not receive a passing score
- If a student fails to obtain a passing score on the Algebra I and/or ELA II test, they can show competency in one of three alternate ways:

Demonstrate Two Career-Focused Activities*:

Proficient scores on WebXams
A 12-point industry credential
A pre-apprenticeship or acceptance into an approved apprenticeship program

Work-based learning

Option 2.

Enlist in the Military

Show evidence that you have signed a contract to enter a branch of the U.S. armed services upon graduation.



Option 3.

Complete College Coursework

Earn credit for one college-level math and/or college-level English course through Ohio's free College Credit Plus program.



Scheduling Timeline

- Week of January 13th – Counselors Meet With OOMS and OBMS Students
- Week of January 13th – Teachers Begin To Advise Students On Course Selection
 - Teachers Will Make Recommendations and record their recommendations
 - Parents / Guardians Please Sign Scheduling Card
- Week of January 20th – Students Begin Entering Course Requests In Portal
- Week of January 27th – Counselors Collect Schedule Cards And Meet With 8th Grade Students To Verify Course Requests



Scheduling Process

- All course requests (grades 8-11) will be entered by the end of February
- Course availability is based upon the initial volume of requests
- Course requests are NOT an actual schedule
 - Just because a course is requested, does not guarantee it will be included in your child's schedule
- Final day to accept changes to course requests: May 21st, 2020
- Classes and sections will be balanced prior to the start of school
- Student can request a schedule change beginning on the first day of school
- Changing your course requests after the master schedule has been created, may significantly reduce your child's chances of receiving ALL course requests



Commonly Asked Questions

What if a parent or student does not agree with the course recommended by the classroom teacher?

If a teacher recommends a course for your child that doesn't seem to be a best fit, you are required to discuss the placement with your child's teacher.

As long as the student has met the prerequisites, the student/parent may determine the course. You must complete the Course Recommendation Override form to override a teacher recommendation.



Commonly Asked Questions

What if my child wants to take a course that requires an audition (like band, choir or orchestra)?

Students interested in courses that require auditions should place the course on their Schedule Request Sheet. Each student will then meet with the appropriate instructor for an audition, to determine final eligibility.

Auditions will be held in the Spring. Students will be notified of the results following auditions and counselors will adjust the schedules if need be.



Commonly Asked Questions

What if my child wants to come in late or leave a period early?

- Plan for this period on the Course Request Form
- Be certain the Course Request Form has a parent signature
- Late arrival/Early release may not work for every student's schedule and therefore is not guaranteed
- Olentangy does not provide transportation for Late arrival/Early release



Commonly Asked Questions

Should my child take an honors course?

- An honors course provides the student with additional depth and rigor in the subject
- Talk with your child's teachers about his/her recommendation
- Students should challenge themselves with an honors course if they have an interest and/or aptitude in the subject
- Honors courses are not weighted when calculated in a student's GPA



Commonly Asked Questions

Can my child accelerate his/her learning by taking summer school courses?

- Olentangy Local School District offers a Summer Semester. In 2019, the course offerings were online courses in the following:
 - College Prep English 9, 10, 11, 12
 - Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus
 - World History, Geography & World Cultures, US & Global Economics, US Government & Politics, US History since the Civil War
 - College Prep Earth and Space
 - Health, Physical Education, Lifetime Fitness (face-to-face).
 - \$210 per course



Commonly Asked Questions

Do high school courses completed in middle school count as high school credit?

- High School courses completed in middle school (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, &/or Level I of a world language) appear on the high school transcript with a “P” (passing) and the credit awarded
- Students have until the end of September of the senior year to change the “P” to the letter grade
 - If the student elects to take the letter grade, it is calculated as part of the high school cumulative GPA



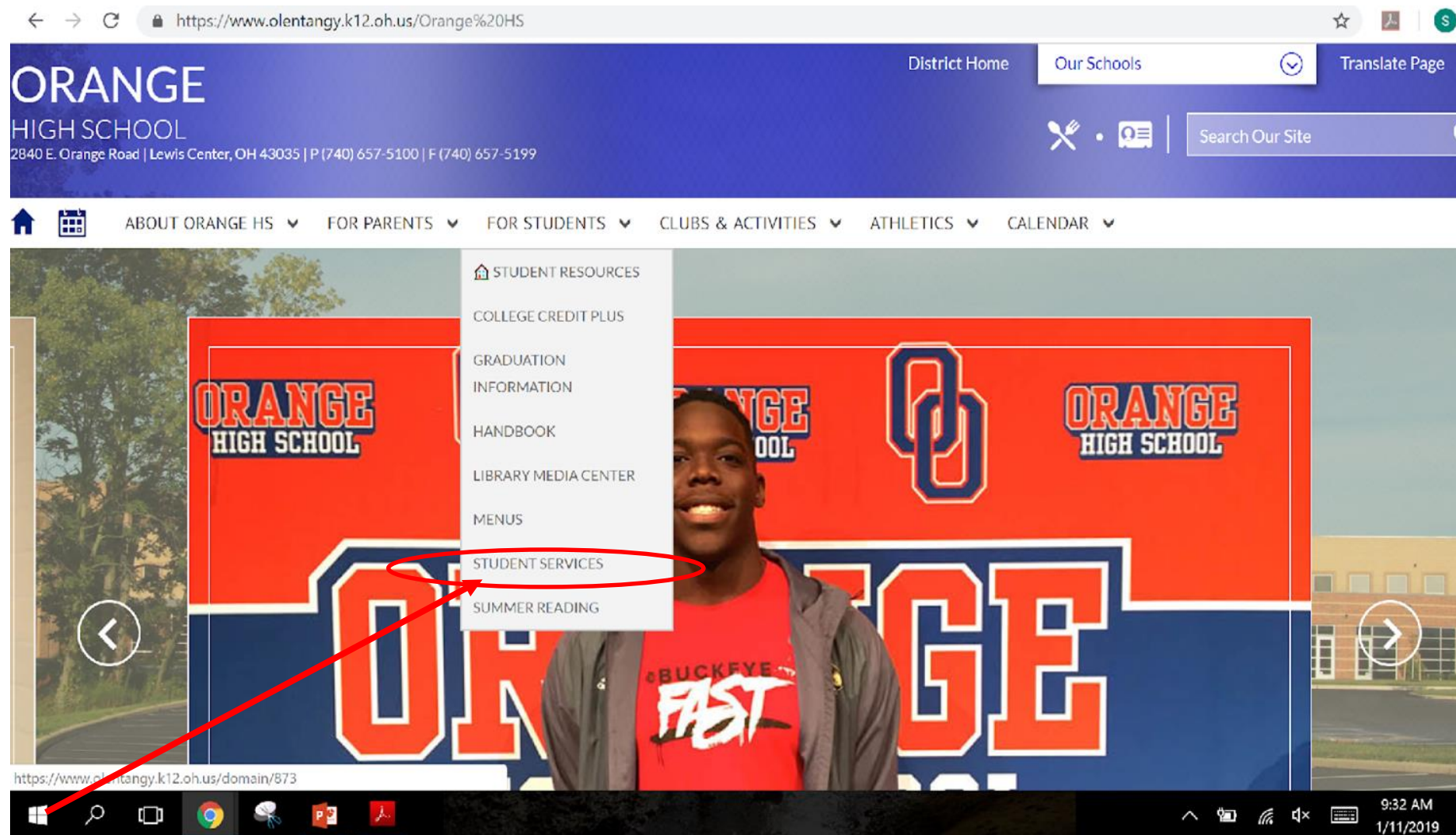

What if my child changes his/her mind about his/her course requests?


- Please indicate changes on the course change form which will be available from your child's student services office.

Olentangy Orange High School Student Services offers a variety of services for our school community.

Five academic counselors, **Pam Otten** (A-De), **Stephen Gunther** (Df-Ja), **Matthew Baumgartner** (Jb-Mt), **Laura Carder** (Mu-Sd)) and **Heather Smith** (Se-Z), provide academic counseling, including assistance with course scheduling, college selection and planning, academic assistance, and more. These counselors are also able to assist students with social and emotional needs. The Student Services secretary, Ann Pfau and guidance aide Cyndie Vande Water are available to assist students and parents with a number of tasks, including registering for college placement tests (SAT and ACT), requesting high school transcripts, processing student fee payments, and using a variety of available college and career resources.

Kara Haney, R.N. (school nurse) and **Anna Pearse** (clinic aide) manage the school clinic. They are available to help students with emergency medical needs, ongoing medical issues, and to provide support and education for health related issues.

Kathy Clemens, the attendance secretary, is available in the Student Services office to assist students with daily attendance, homework collection in the event of extended absences, college visits, and other classroom attendance related areas. **Attendance Hotline: (740) 657-5130**
